As part of the **ecumenical prayer cycle**, we ask you to pray for a particular region of the world each week. This week we pray for Myanmar (Burma) and Thailand. We give thanks for Thailand's support for refugees from Myanmar, Laos, Cambodia, and Vietnam; for those working on behalf of exploited children; for the Christian Conference of Asia and the Myanmar Council of Churches; and for Buddhist and Christian dialogue, which strives to break down old barriers and find common cause for hope and peace. We pray for children in Myanmar, especially the child soldiers, orphans, refugees, and those forced into labor and prostitution; for those imprisoned unjustly and who endure spiritual and physical oppression; for women and girls and their protection from rape and forced labor; for the stateless Rohingyas from Rakhon State and other internally displaced people and refugees; for Christians in Myanmar who undergo discrimination and forced reconversion to majority religions; and for those struggling to rebuild their lives after the destruction of tsunamis and typhoons; for an end to corruption and crime, drug use and sex tourism.
