As part of the ecumenical prayer cycle, we ask you to pray for a particular region of the world each week. This week we pray for Belarus, Moldova, Russia, and Ukraine. We give thanks for priests, pastors and lay people who gave up their lives during communist oppression; for the long history of Christianity in these lands; for those Christians who consider as important the dialogue with other Christians from different confessions; for choirs that sing God's praises; for beautiful churches which announce the community of the faithful; for church bells, onion domes, deep bass voices chanting the psalms, and icons of the saints; and for those who work for democracy and openness in government. We pray for guidance, as these nations work to reconfigure political and economic structures; for compassion and integrity for all peoples in these nations with such diverse ethnic histories; for those who suffer from alcoholism, HIV and AIDS, tuberculosis and other life-threatening diseases; for the large numbers of people who now live in poverty and are unemployed; for revitalization of the churches after decades of official atheism; for those in Belarus and Ukraine who suffer from the continued effects of the Chernobyl nuclear disaster; and for those who struggle for democracy and truthfulness in the media.
